## The three components of Babylon







All this has to do with modernism. What about our evangelicalism? We profess the supreme authority of God and of His word: but how does it work out in our lives? It is not only possible, but all too common, to be evangelical in doctrine and modernist in practice, giving mental assent to the great doctrinal tenets of the "faith once delivered to the saints", and at the same time refusing obedience to the standards of gospel living enunciated with equal authority in Holy Writ. It is one thing to study the Scriptures for theological exactness, another to submit to them for the regulating of one's life. Dogmatically we acknowledged Christ Jesus as Lord, which title we hold as the title of His deity; then how can we yield other than practical submission to Him as the "Lord of our lives and God of our salvation"? Full consecration and complete obedience are the only logical answer to our profession as evangelicals. Rome points to the modernist brand of Protestantism as a fine example of that Scripture which says: "In those days there was no king in Israel: every man did that which was right in his own eyes" (Judg. 21:25). It is ours to demonstrate that there is a King in Israel. (P. 115)

#### The secularization of conscience: Paul Strohm

Paradoxically, it could be said that it was the consequence of 16th- and 17th-century evangelical fervour. The relationship between conscience and organized religion did not end then altogether. It enjoys considerable support in institutionalized Christianity. The divine presence still exists quite strongly in the notion of conscience. 'The secularization of conscience' examines how conscience drifted from its strong Christian ties, became 'unchurched', and was adopted by 18th-century philosophers. Enlightenment philosophers rejected a narrow conception of conscience and opened its deliberations to larger horizons of social consensus.

#### Study the Word

#### THE ORIGIN OF SPECIES

#### INTRODUCTION

When on board H. M. S. Beagle, as naturalist, I was much struck with certain facts in the distribution of the organic beings inhabiting South America, and in the geological relations of the present to the past inhabitants of that continent. These facts, as will be seen in the latter chapters of this volume, seemed to throw some light on the origin of species—that mystery of mysteries, as it has been called by one of our greatest philosophers. On my return home it occurred to me, in 1837, that something might per-

it has been called by one of our greatest philosophers. On my return home it occurred to me, in 1837, that something might perhaps be made out on this question by patiently accumulating and reflecting on all sorts of facts which could possibly have any bearing on it. After five years work I allowed myself to speculate on the subject, and drew up some short notes; these I enlarged in 1844 into a sketch of the conclusions which then seemed to me probable: from that period to the present day I have steadily pursued the same object. I hope that I may be excused for entering on these personal details, as I give them to show that I have not been hasty in coming to a decision.

my sketch of 1844—honored me by thinking it advisable to publish, with Mr. Wallace's excellent memoir, some brief extracts from my manuscripts.

On May 8, 1844, the leader of the Roman Catholic Church, Pope Gregory XVI, sent a letter to members of the Catholic hierarchy condemning the Bible societies as basically enemies of Catholicism, and argued against what he termed the indiscriminate circulation of the Scriptures to lay people. This letter was published in the New York *Herald*, on July 15, 1844., and reads in part, as follows:

"Those Bible societies... only care audaciously to stimulate *all* to a private interpretation of the divine oracles, to inspire contempt for divine *traditions*, which the Catholic Church preserves upon the authority of the holy fathers..."

"The reading of the Holy Bible translated into the vulgar [i.e., common] tongue, should not be permitted except to... confirm [people] in the faith... No version whatever should be permitted to be read but those which should be approved of by the Holy See [i.e., the Vatican], accompanied by notes derived from the writings of the Holy Fathers, or other learned Catholic authors..."

"We confirm and renew the decrees... against the publication, distribution, reading and possession of books of the Holy Scriptures translated into the vulgar [i.e., common] tongue. (Cited in Jerome L. Clark, 1844, vol.1, Religious Movements (Nashville, Southern Publishing, 1968), 253-254 (emphasis added).

# genuine rebellion

I question whether genuine rebellion is ever curable. Study in Patriarchs and Prophets the rebellion of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram. This rebellion was extended, including more than two men. It was led by two hundred and fifty princes of the congregation, men of renown. Call rebellion by its right name and apostasy by its right name, and then consider that the experience of the ancient people of God with all its objectionable features was faithfully chronicled to pass into history. The Scripture declares, "These things ... are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come" (1 Corinthians 10:11). And if men and women who have the knowledge of the truth are so far separated from their great Leader that they will take the great leader of apostasy and name him Christ our Righteousness, it is because they have not sunk deep into the mines of the truth. They are not able to distinguish the precious ore from the base material. { 2SM 393.2}

Rev 20:4 And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were **beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God**, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years.

Now what does Satan propose to do? He proposes that he is capable of changing this Bible. These parties that fell understand all about heaven, and that they can bring in the different sentiments from the Bible, and they are going to have a revision of it. You will see they will make revisions of the Bible, but every one of us needs to stand intelligently on the Word. We cannot afford to be careless, but we must have that simplicity of godliness that is a virtue to us. We must have it. 25LtMs, Ms 80, 1910, par. 10

It is the mind and character of the persons who study the Scriptures that makes the study dangerous. The difficulties will be removed from the way of those who search the Scriptures with earnest, humble hearts, praying to the Lord for wisdom. There is to be no cutting out of Scripture, no mutilating the Word, as the Catholics have done. The Bible is to be searched as a whole. The things in it hard to be understood will become plain through the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit. 13LtMs, Ms 132, 1898, par. 4

Do you desire to destroy the covenant between yourselves and your God? "A perpetual covenant" means just what it says. "It is a sign between Me and the children of Israel forever;" God declares, "for in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day He rested, and was refreshed." 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## They support this position by invoking 2 Pet 1:20 and ignoring vs 21

2Pe 1:20 Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation.

2Pe 1:21 For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.

Herein lies the answer to both the error of private interpretation and the heresy of Papal interpretation.



"The soul in the OT means not a part of man, but the whole man as a living being. Similarly in the NT, it signifies human life: the life of an individual conscious object. Recent exegetes... have maintained that the NT does not teach the immortality of the soul in the Hellenistic sense of survival of an immortal principle after death"

Pope Leo X who on Monday, December 19th, 1513 issued a Bull (*Apostoloici regimis*) declaring:

"We do condemn and reprobate all who assert that the intelligent soul is mortal."

"Damnamus et reprobamus omnes assertentes animam intellectivam mortalem ess."

This bull was directed against the growing "heresy" of those who denied the natural immortality of the soul, and avowed the conditional immortality of man.

Even early spiritistic leaders admitted that their communication was with Satan himself. In *Spritter*, a Norwegian Spirits periodical the following statement is made:


Spiritism is the serpent in Paradise offering man to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

Moses Hull, a leading spirits lecturer of that early time makes the following statement:

A Truthful Snake.... In answer to the question, 'who then, are we to believe - God or Satan?' I answer, 'The facts, in every case in the Bible, justify us in believing Satan, he has ever been truthful, that is more than can be said of the other one... It was not the devil, but God who made the mistake in the Garden of Eden... It was God, and not the devil, who was a murderer from the beginning.' 2
