marvelous are thy works and that my soul

knoweth right well
15:32
now i come from the scientific
15:34
fraternity
15:35
and they don't believe in creation
15:39
in fact they say that science cannot
15:42
allow a divine foot in the door
15:47
god must be totally separated from
15:49
science
15:52
if you believe in creation then you will
15:55
believe

that whatever god created was good
15:59
how good very good aha does he say that
16:03

yes yes we go through the days of

well there was a particular vector
23:05
that was causing disease whatever it is
23:08
if it was
23:09
smallpox or if it was polio
23:12
or whatever it was and
23:16
in those cases you would take the vector
23:19
and you would take a weakened form of it
23:22
either by injecting the dead vector
23:26
or a heat damaged vector so that it
23:29
wouldn't effectively give you the
23:31
disease
23:32
but that there was enough of it there
23:34
for your body to
23:36
create an immune response and then your
23:39

body would create
23:41
antibodies against this antigen
23:44
that was introduced into your body
23:47
and then your cells would remove it
23:51
take it through the liver or through the
23:53
kidneys depending on the species
23:55
and eliminate the danger out of your
23:57
body that's how it used to work
24:00
now that is something that is
24:05
scientific your body would react to any
24:08
foreign
24:09
body that comes into you in the same way
24:13
and create this response and that is
24:16
something that worked
24:18
it certainly helped with smallpox and
24:20
polio
24:21
and all of these issues
24:24
then later they started perfecting it
24:27
and they started adding
24:31
things to the vaccines
24:34
and nanoparticles of aluminium were
24:38
added
24:38
and many many other components and
24:41

multiple
24:42
vaccines were created and you know the
24:45
is the human body designed to cope with
24:48
a whole plethora of diseases at the same
24:51
time
24:53
all of these issues then become
24:55
important
24:56
because it later became an issue
24:59
not only of human health
25:03
it became an industry yes and that's
25:06
important
25:07
and it became a very lucrative industry
25:12
and fear is a great driving force in
25:15
a lucrative industry like this and over
25:18
the years people have
25:21
expressed some of these fears and made
25:23
some correlations

and the mainstream has rejected that

and many of the videos that were made on

this

issue were just summarily discarded
25:35
some of them were removed i mean you
25:38
know about that
25:40

and the question is is there anything
25:43
of substance in what these people are
25:46
saying

now there was a video made where
25:50
they talked about the effect of vaccines
25:54
on autism and other issues and
25:57
this was very rapidly removed let's just
26:01
look at
26:02
some of the issues that were raised
26:04
there we're not
26:05
taking a stand we're just giving
26:08
information
26:09
at this stage
26:11

so you make the documentary the position

has been given

the data shows us in 1975
26:20
one in every 5 000 kid has autism
26:24
1982 one in 2500 1994
26:28
one in 500 2 000 1 and 166 2004 1 and

150

2009 1 and 110 2011 168
26:37
2013 1 and 45 projected 2032
26:41

one out of every two kid is gonna have

26:43

all right that's catastrophic right

26:46

you put the documentary out there

26:48

tribeca turns it down

26:50

robert de niro who is somebody

26:51

politically would have typically

26:53

disagreed with someone like you but

26:54

because at the time

26:55

his 16 year old son has autism he's

26:58

around 21 22 today

26:59

he's emotionally connected to it and

27:01

he's trying to hold himself back he says

27:02

i believe everybody should watch this

27:04

right

27:04

okay yeah everybody starts looking at

27:06

this

27:08

emails you've gotten from both sides

27:09

people that have connected with you from

27:11

both sides

27:12

what's been the best argument you've

27:14

gotten

27:15

from those who say dell you're a fool

27:18

you're absolutely wrong you're not even

27:19

looking at it from this standpoint why
27:21
are you still doing this
27:22
arguing about vaccine this is a hoax
27:24
this is a propaganda you're hurting so
27:26
many kids lives you're doing this
27:27
i work on the doctor's television show
27:30
so i started asking every doctor i knew
27:32
including
27:33
hosts on the doctors and i said if
27:36
i'm wrong show me where i'm wrong i want
27:40
off this road i mean i'm all about the

truth

please show me explain to me what i'm

missing here how is this data

wrong how is it show me a study that can

28:02
anti-vaccine
28:03
i'm anti-injecting number one products

that don't do for safety studies

and number two products that have
28:08
liability protection meaning
28:10
i cannot sue the manufacturer if it does
28:13
injure me or does injure my children
28:15
and the reason that's problematic is i
28:17
know since they've never been able to be
28:19
sued since the 1986 act that took
28:21
all liability away there's been no
28:24
market incentive
28:25
to evolve the science of vaccines they
28:28
have
28:28
absolutely zero risk so you know money
28:32
people
28:32
why would anybody spend money for no
28:35
reason
28:35
to evolve a product and make it safer
28:38
than it already is if you can't sue them
28:40
anyway
28:40
vaccine cover 19 with them telling us
28:43
the fact that you know
28:44
it's the most important vaccine we got
28:46
to take if it comes out
28:47
now obviously at this point of the game
28:49

you don't seem very
28:50
confident about any of the vaccines
28:52
yourself but if they come out with this
28:54
vaccine and they're presenting it to us
28:56
that we ought to take it whether it's
28:57
voucher or gates
28:58
how confident are you and us needing to

take this cover 19 vaccine

so the issue of autism

i mean that has been trashed by the

victorian police can now enter homes

without a

warrant as part of a new four-stage
30:25
lockdown restrictions announced this
30:28
week victoria
30:29
premier dan andrews has cited harsher
30:32
penalties for those found
30:34
not following covert 19 directions
30:38
so the police are involved now
30:41
what if the covert 19 directions start
30:45

including enforced vaccination yes
30:48
would the police then also be involved
30:51
definitely the public health and
30:54
wellbeing
30:54
act of 2008 states that authorities can
30:57
close
30:58
any premises and without a warrant
31:01
into any premises and search for and
31:04
sees
31:05
anything that is necessary for the
31:07
purpose of investigating eliminating or
31:09
reducing the risk of public health
31:13
so we do have a situation in the world
31:16
today
31:17
where public authority can interfere
31:22
in your personal choices that's just the
31:25
fact
31:26
now they're saying this is for the
31:28
common good right correct
31:30
now where does that idea come from again
31:32
jesuits
31:35
and it's not only in just in australia
31:38
now in new york they've also
31:42

starting to implement the same type of
31:44
measures
31:45
okay so let's have a look at that just
31:48
to see where we're going
31:51
so today de Blasio announced that he
31:53
plans to encircle the entire city
31:55
with military-style checkpoints not to
31:58
stop violent criminals
31:59
but prevent people from visiting from
32:01
other places
32:03
there was no public discussion of this
32:04
ahead of time there was no debate de
32:06
Blasio
32:06
just decreed it so starting today we're
32:10
going to do something
32:10
new in New York City we will have
32:12
checkpoints at key
32:14
entry points to the city travelers
32:16
coming in from those states
32:18
will be given information about the
32:21
quarantine they will be reminded that it
32:23
is required not optional
32:25
they'll be reminded that failure to
32:28

quarantine is
32:29
a violation of state law and it comes
32:32
with serious
32:32
penalties in fact under certain
32:34
